You probably already know that Jesus Christ is God's Son; but He is not just like any other son—and He, too, is one in God. Let me explain!

Do you know what the Trinity is? The Trinity is the word we use to describe God in three persons. The Bible tells us that God exists as three persons in one. The three persons are God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. That can be very hard to understand, so let's look at something a bit simpler. Let's look at a chicken egg. We know a chicken egg by recognizing all the parts—there is the shell, the egg white, and the egg yolk. All parts of the egg are a bit different, but they all make up the same egg. It wouldn't be a proper egg if it didn't contain all the elements.

The Trinity is somewhat like that but even better! God in three persons is God being the Son (Jesus), while being the Father, and while being the Holy Spirit all at once–God in three persons!

But how can we know that Jesus was really God? Some people think He was just a very nice man. What makes Jesus different than a very nice man?

Jesus never sinned. Not even once. Even though He lived His life on Earth just like you and me, He did it perfectly by not sinning. He had the same kind of body as us, the same sort of feelings as us, and He was tempted to do wrong things just like us! But because He was God, He never gave in to those temptations, and He never sinned.

Jesus actually gave His life and died for our sins so that we could know Him as our Savior. Jesus dying for us was very heroic, but anyone can die for another person. Only Jesus was able to die and rise from the dead. That is how we know He is God's Son. He never sinned, He gave up His life for us, and He rose from the dead.

Let's go back to that egg. If we cracked that egg or busted the shell, it would be impossible for us to make it whole again. A broken egg cannot go back to being unbroken. Jesus allowed His body to be broken for us. He even died. But unlike the egg or anything else in this world, Jesus was able to put Himself back together again wholly and alive! We worship Jesus because of His life, death, and Resurrection, and we praise Him because He is our Savior!
